

Subchapter V: All-Terrain Vehicles

14.50 ATV Routes

Except as provided in Section 23.33, Wis. Stats., no person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle upon any public street, alley, right-of-way, park or any other public property in the City except as hereinafter designated:

- (1) Lake Decorah: Operation of all-terrain vehicles is authorized on Lake Decorah during the Winter, provided such operation not occur within 100 feet of any private property.
- (2) Riverside Park: Operation of all-terrain vehicles is authorized in Riverside Park during the winter, but only for the purpose of access to Lake Decorah or the purpose of temporarily parking the all-terrain vehicle while the operator visits the downtown area of the City.
- (3) Designated Route: Operation of all-terrain vehicles is authorized on those streets and highways designated by the Chief of Police; provided, however, no operation may occur until after
 - (a) The all-terrain vehicle route authorized by the Chief is properly marked,
 - (b) A copy of the route is sent to the Juneau County Sheriff's Department and Department of Natural Resources in accordance with Section 23.33(11) Wis. Stats., and
 - (c) The route is placed upon a City map, designated as the official City All-Terrain Vehicle Route Map, which shall be made available for public inspection at City Hall.

Designation of an all-terrain vehicle route by the Chief is subject to control of the Council. Any all-terrain vehicle route designated by the Chief may be terminated at any time by the Chief or Council upon notice to the foregoing authorities.

14.51 Additional Regulations

- (1) Hours of Operation: No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle within the City limits between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Sunday through Thursday, or between midnight and 8:00 a.m. on Friday through Saturday.
- (2) Unattended All-Terrain Vehicles: No person shall leave or allow an all-terrain vehicle owned or operated by him to remain unattended on any public property while the motor is running or with the starting key left in the ignition.
- (3) Sidewalks: No operator shall operate an all-terrain vehicle on any sidewalk or pedestrian way within the City.

(4) Private Property: No operator shall operate an all-terrain vehicle on any private property not owned or controlled by him without the express permission of the property owner.

(5) Speed: No person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle upon any designated route within the City limits or at Riverside Park at a speed in excess of ten miles per hour.

(6) Rules of the Road: The operator of an all-terrain vehicle in the City shall comply with and shall be subject to the statutory sections set forth in section 346.02(11) Wis. Stats., which sections have been adopted by section 14.10 above.
